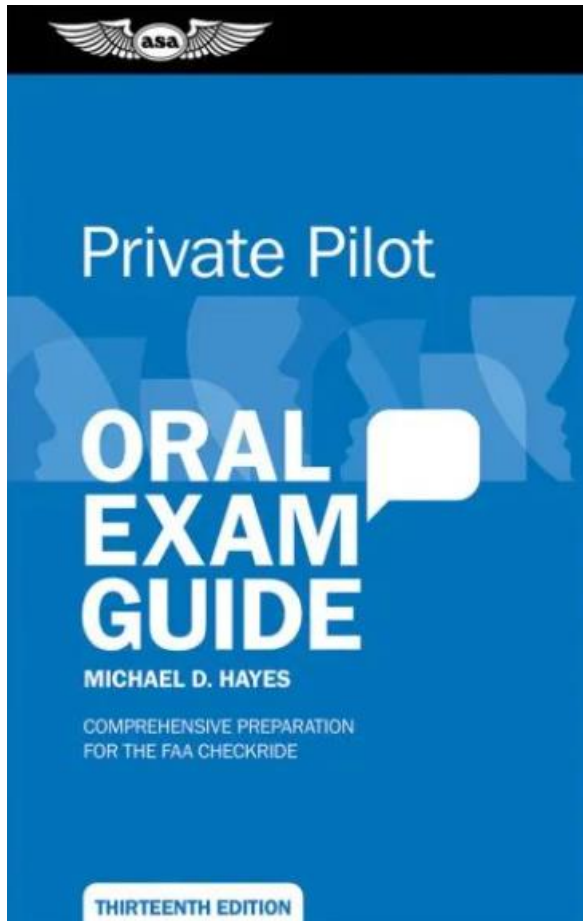


Private Pilot Oral Guide

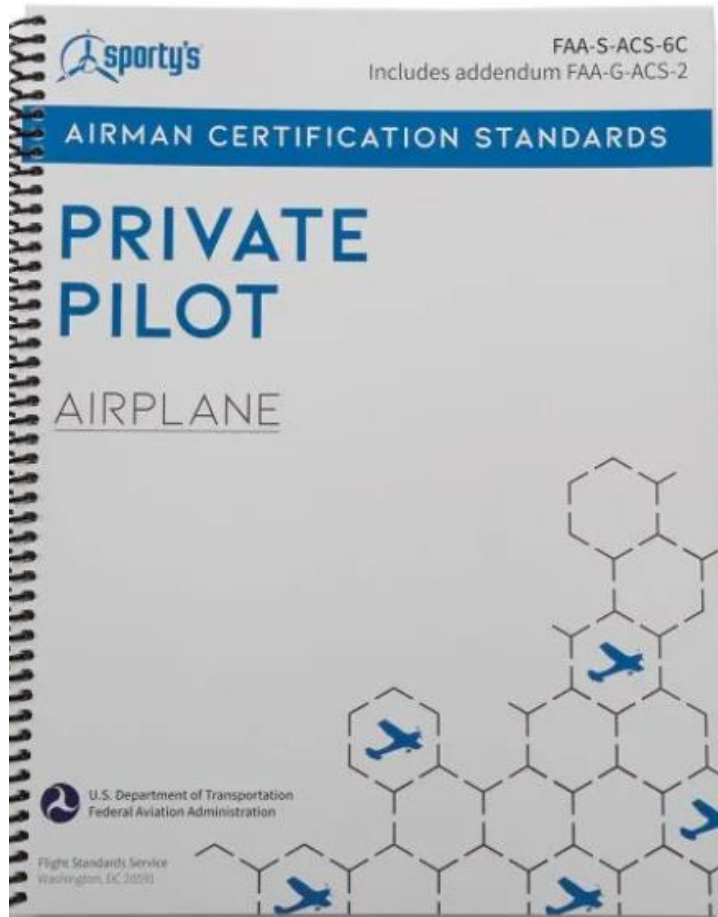


Private Pilot ACS

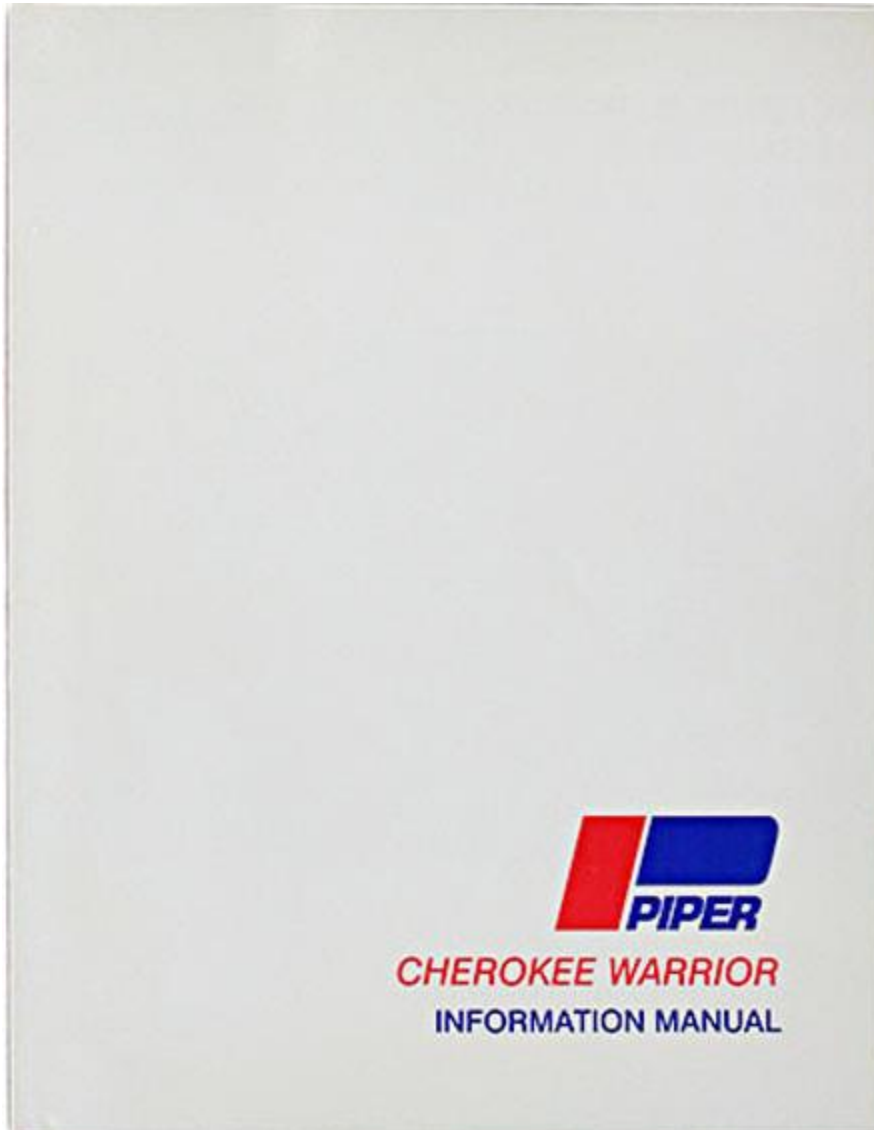


Cherokee Warrior Information Manual

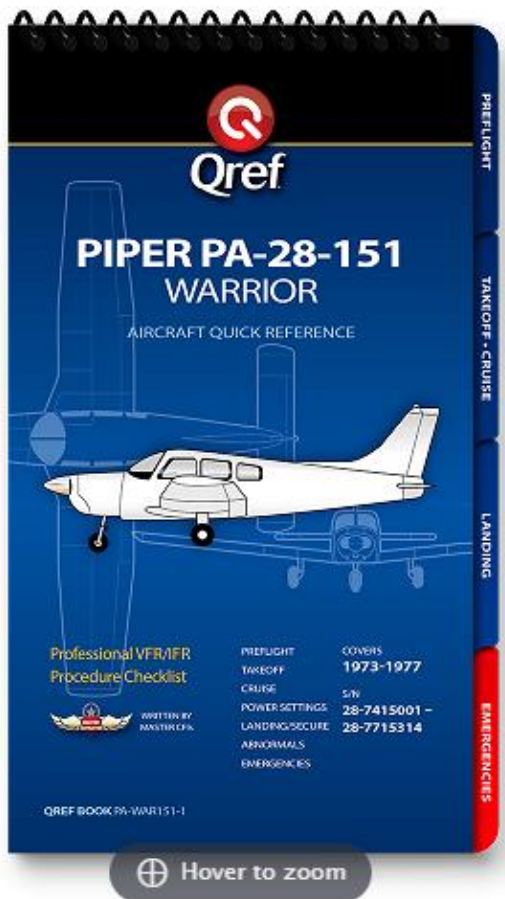


Qref Piper PA28-151 Warrior Checklist

Purpose: You will use this to determine speed, fuel usage, flight time, and other information during your cross-country planning. I recommend the getting the plotter pictured below as opposed to the electronic calculator versions. The plotter shown below is much less expensive and it gives the student an idea of how the calculations are determined.

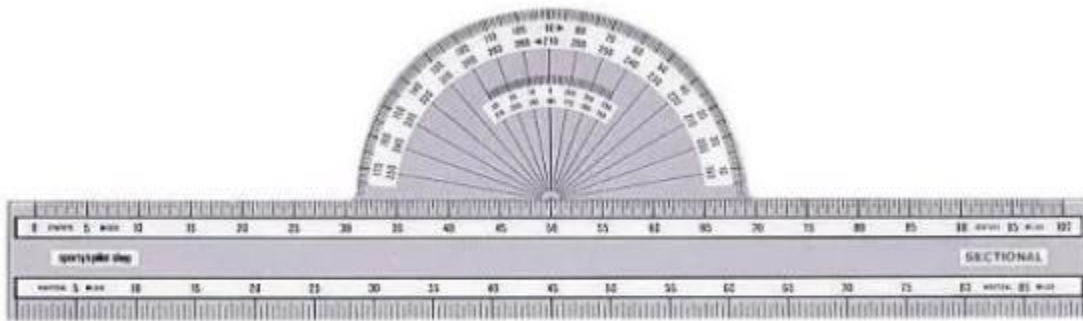


Plotter

Purpose: You will use this in combination with the VFR sectional charts to plot straight lines and determine flight direction and course.

IFR training glasses (aka Foggles)

Purpose: These glasses will be used during your instrument training. The purpose of these is to block your view of the outside and only allow you to see your instruments.

Electronic device with ForeFlight

Purpose: ForeFlight is an app that contains all the “chart” information that you will need both when planning flights and when actually flying. Having ForeFlight on a small iPad is best, but you can also use it on your cell phone. Ask your instructor if you have any questions about exactly what subscription you should buy.
